This Paper Development Workshop and Colloquium is supported by Organization Special issue "Decolonising Management and Organizational Knowledge.

The Colloquium creates an opportunity for a more broad-based conversation on decolonising concerns within management academia and practice under the Decolonising Management and Organisational Knowledge theme. Participants will present their idea/s to colleagues in the field and some senior scholars for guidance on developing the manuscript. Taking into consideration the problematics of having a decolonising conversation in English, the organizing committee is open to abstracts in other languages. Participating colleagues will serve as translators.

### Extended Abstracts

Extended Abstracts should be restricted to 3000 words. Abstracts can focus on empirical or theoretical work. The title must be followed by the full name(s) of author(s) and their affiliation(s), email address(es) and telephone number(s). The contents of the abstracts should include where relevant:

- Scope of the work indicating the primary objective of the study.
- Methods.
- Major findings and conclusions.
- Implications for research
- Key words
